


Dr. David Gattie

David Gattie is an Associate Professor of Engineering in the University of Georgia's College of Engineering, and a Senior Fellow in the University of Georgia's (UGA) Center for International Trade and Security and School of Public & International Affairs. He earned his B.S. and Ph.D. from UGA and has 14 years of private industry experience as an energy services engineer and environmental engineer. His research is in the area of energy policy and integrated energy resource planning for the power sector, and he teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in energy systems and energy security. Gattie currently works in UGA's Center for International Trade and Security on an Energy Security Initiative, focused on the geopolitical and U.S. national security implications of energy and energy technologies within the challenges of 21st century great power competition. He has provided testimony before the U.S. House Energy and Commerce Committee on

energy, climate and nuclear power policy, various Georgia state legislative committees, and the Georgia Public Service Commission.

The NTUA service territory is 27,000 square miles, spreading across northern Arizona, northwestern New Mexico and a small portion of southeastern Utah (roughly equal to the size of the state of West Virginia).

Haase graduated from the University of Illinois with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering. He later earned his MBA from Keller Graduate School of Management located in Chicago. He is a licensed Professional Engineer, with certification in Illinois and North Carolina and former Chairman of the American Public Power

Association board. He has been a member of APPA for more than 30 years. For the past 15 years at NTUA, he has been dedicated to find avenues to connect the homes of thousands of Navajo families living without electricity. "Light Up Navajo" is one project that has brought lifestyle positive change to hundreds of families.
